Entrance Tram Stop

1900s Town

- Meet the deadly and dangerous animals in the Bank Board Room.
- Look out in the bank, you can count on some spooky goings on!
- Pick up some sweet and not-so-sweet treats in Jubilee Confectioners.
- Venture into the spooky Sun Inn.
- Ravensworth Terrace: Look out for the evil music teacher in No. 2. Are you brave enough to venture into the dentist's in No. 3? In No. 4, hear spooky sounds from the Ran Tanners.
- In the park bandstand, be amazed by the fire display at 7pm, 8pm and 9pm and the bubbleologist at 7.30pm and 8.30pm.
- Co-op: be transformed by our fiendish facepainter in the hardware (children only), try the latest in witch and wizard's fashion in the drapers.
- In the garage, marvel at the bunco booth and bubbleologist.
- Discover what spells and potions are being created in the chemist's.
- Pose for a petrifying portrait in the photographer's studio, showing off your own Halloween costumes (extra charge applies, appointments available on a first come, first served basis).

1950s Front Street Terrace

- Are you ready for the haunting sounds of the saw violinist in the chapel?

- See what's going on in the petrifying pit pony stables.

Colliery Yard

- Be amazed by the fantastic fire shows at 6.45pm, 7.45pm and 8.45pm.
- Experience an owl encounter in the lamp cabin.
- What's that on the gibbet near the Heapstead?

Birch Wood

- Look out as you take the path through Birch Wood... was that something moving in the trees?
